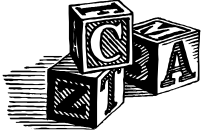


Acts 2:12 And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another,

Response Questions for "The Beginning of the Gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God"



Basic Ideas from Mark 1:1.

1. The intent of Mark's account is for the reader to know what the gospel is.
2. In knowing the gospel, the reader is invited to choose Jesus Christ as their only Savior and Lord.
3. In choosing Jesus, the reader is to feel the joy of who He is and what He has done in their behalf.

Basic Questions from Mark 1:1.

1. What is your initial impression of the gospel?
2. How important is it to live with hope?
3. What emotion does hope stir within the heart?
4. Is humility a fruit that is evident in the believing?

Basic Application from Mark 1:1.

1. Do you believe Jesus *is* the good news?
2. I can call you to recognize you are a sinner and that you need a Savior, but if you recognize that Jesus *is* the good news, then you already know how helpless you are against your sin and how hopeless the future looks for you.
3. For many of us, there was a point in time when we came to see Him as the good news. I am calling you to remember that He was good news, He is good news, and He will forever be good news.
4. Share your testimony with those who are around you. Share with them when you first began to understand the gospel.
