Response Questions for, "Jesus Christ, Lord over Demons" (Mark 5:1-20)



Basic Ideas from Mark 5:1-20.

The Holy Spirit is calling to us from this passage to consider three ideas.

1. The Holy Spirit desires for us to know that God is more powerful than anything created and that He has power over the demonic realm.
2. The Holy Spirit desires for us to choose Jesus as our King and to reject the authority of the devil.
3. The Holy Spirit desires for us to feel the joy of resting in the power and glory of Jesus Christ.



Basic Questions from Mark 5:1-20.

1. How is the demoniac described in our text?
2. Is demonic possession possible today?
3. Think about the financial loss experienced by those who owned the pigs. What might they be thinking?
4. How is the delivered demoniac described in verse 15?
5. What was his immediate response in verse 18?
6. What did our Lord want him to do?
7. What internal storm are you looking to Jesus for deliverance in and from?
8. Do you believe He is able?
9. How do we identify demonic activity today in our culture?
10. Is every case of addiction demonic in origin?
11. Can believers be demonically possessed?
12. Can believers be attacked?
13. How can believers engage in spiritual warfare?
14. What application can we make from this text?



The **Basic Application** from Mark 5:1-20.

1. Demonic possession takes many shapes. Demonic influence can cripple the child of God into believing the lie. God is able to deliver you from your storm, and no matter what, He is able to deliver you in your storm. You can have peace and rest no matter what your internal chains might be.
2. God wills you to be free from your demons. Call out to Him. He is mighty to save.
3. Jesus is here to deliver you from the power of sin.
4. Thank God Jesus has absolute *authority* over the spiritual world. Thank God greater is He that is in you than he that is in the world (John 16:33, I John 4:4)
5. Learn to offer yourself in faith to the absolute authority of Jesus Christ.
6. Pray that you will stand against the wiles of the devil (Eph. 6:11). Pray that you will be a positive example of one who has been delivered from the shackles of sin. Pray for deliverance, if you are yet under the power of sin.
7. What does this story cause you to change in your thinking and/or actions?
