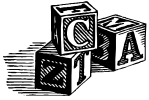


Acts 2:12 And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another,

"What Does This Mean?"

"He will see His offspring - The Beginning"

Read Isaiah 53:10, 11; Mark 15:39-47



Basic Ideas from "He will see His offspring - The Beginning", Isaiah 53:10, 11; Mark 15:39-47. The Holy Spirit is calling to us from this passage to consider three ideas.

1. The Holy Spirit desires for us to know the power of His *Story* to redeem sinners and adopts sons.
2. The Holy Spirit desires for us to choose His path, not our own.
3. The Holy Spirit desires for us to feel the joy of resting in His *Story* and the completion of it.



Basic Questions from, "He will see His offspring - The Beginning", Isaiah 53:10, 11; Mark 15:39-47

1. Why is the confession of the centurion significant?
2. What was it about the manner our Lord died that convinced the centurion of His sonship?
3. Why is the commitment of the women significant?
4. What can it be contrasted with?
5. What might this tell us about women in general?
6. Why is Joseph's courage significant?
7. What did it cost him to follow?
8. Who else of rank joined him?
9. What might all of these examples tell us about our faith?



The **Basic Application** from, "He will see His offspring - The Beginning", Isaiah 53:10, 11; Mark 15:39-47

1. The cross is not the end, but the beginning.
2. His death is not the end, but the means to the end.
3. Your redemption and adoption bring Him glory.
4. God will not relent. He will complete the *Story* He wrote.
