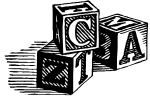


Acts 2:12 And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another,

Response Questions for, "The Hero Arrives - Part 1," (Luke 2:25-38).



Basic Ideas from, "The Hero Arrives - Part 1," (Luke 2:25-38).

The Holy Spirit is calling to us from this passage to consider three ideas.

1. The Holy Spirit desires for us to know the hero has arrived and lives in our midst.
2. The Holy Spirit desires for us to choose to follow the hero and not the villain.
3. The Holy Spirit desires for us to feel the joy of following the hero and not the villain.

1. The story is all about the person and purpose of God. What are you doing in recognition of this? How does your life reflect the story?
2. What valuable insight might you offer to those younger than you in order to guide them into this most blessed time?



The **Basic Application** from, "The Hero Arrives - Part 1," (Luke 2:25-38).

1. What do you need to change in order to honor the hero's arrival?
2. What preparation are you making in anticipation of His arrival?
3. As believers we have the unique privilege to pause each year and reflect on the storyline of God, to consider the villain and the hero and to give God glory for His power, justice, and grace. May we not squander this tremendous opportunity and trivialize the hero's arrival.
