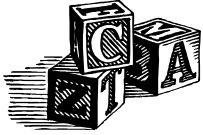


Acts 2:12 And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another,

Response Questions for Why I need a Savior – Nicodemus “You must be born again” (John 3:1-15).



Basic Ideas from John 3:1-15.

1. The Holy Spirit desires for us to know the pressing need to be born again.
2. The Holy Spirit desires for us to choose Christ in order to be born again.
3. The Holy Spirit desires for us to feel the joy and rest of being born again.

Basic Questions from John 3:1-15.

1. Does everyone need to be born-again?
2. Have you been born-again?
3. On whom does regeneration rest – God or man?
4. Can rebirth happen in any other way? For example, can it happen through social reforms or education of the individual?
5. What does it mean to be born again?
6. Can a person be born again who does not recognize their need?
7. Is the act of regeneration “felt” by the senses?
8. Think about the following material and discuss its application to you as a follower of Jesus Christ.

Basic Application from John 3:1-15.

1. None of the arguments we bring for delay can stop what is essential: you and I must be born-again if we are to see the kingdom of heaven.
2. We can still be like Nicodemus in the study of the text, “How can this be?” (John 3:9). We know what the text is saying, but do we understand the significance of what is said? May God open our eyes to the truth of His word.
